

New Soliciting Ordinance in Effect

All Alabaster door-to-door solicitors, whether nonprofit or for-profit, must obtain a permit from Alabaster City Hall. According to the solicitation ordinance, every group or individual who solicits door-to-door must obtain a permit from the city and keep it in their possession while soliciting. The ordinance applies to every organization including Scouts and door-to-door salespeople.

For-profit organizations also are required to have current Alabaster business licenses to furnish upon request while soliciting. If you purchase an item from a solicitor, you must be given a receipt showing the item received, the selling entity's name, the price paid and the "fair-market value" for the item received.

Flushing Out the Sewer Pump Problem

Our sewers are designed to take away wastewater from sinks and baths, as well as toilet paper flushed down the commode. They are not



designed to cope with many modern disposable products, and as a result these items are causing blockages. If

not resolved, this will eventually lead to a major expense and an environmental hazard for Weatherly residents.

To prevent major damage to the Weatherly sewer pump and

to our environment, the following items should be disposed of in the household garbage and not placed in the toilet and sewer system:

- Sanitary Towels
- Cloth Diapers (all sizes)
- Napkins
- Handy Wipes
- Cotton Balls

Cooler weather and moist soils offer ideal conditions for fall planting. Plant health depends on root health, and in the fall, the warm soil encourages root growth until the ground freezes. In early spring, roots begin new growth and continue to develop before the top of the plant begins to develop leaves, flowers and new stems. This gives fall plants an advantage. Their roots are well established before summer arrives and are far better equipped to deal with heat and drought.

Curbside Pick-up of Debris

The Public Works Department for the city has asked us to remind residents that materials accumulated by contractors or other individuals that you pay for services are not to be left for curbside pick-up. It is the responsibility of the contractor or the resident to have this material disposed of. These paid services include but are not limited to tree trimming, lawn care and excavating.

Curbside pickup services are restricted to one load per daily pick-up for each resident with the maximum load being 10 cubic yards. This is approximately the size of a pick-up truck.
